Auto Museum/Grand Mesa, Colorado Trip

Don Colman has put together another interesting trip to include fantastic scenery and interesting auto museums for our club's trip in September. The time-frame is September 16 through the 19th.

Grand Junction is having a big Wine Festival on this particular weekend so rooms are filling up fast.

We will leave Salt Lake the morning of September 16 and head to Grand Junction, through Vernal, to Rangely, then over Douglas Pass and onto Grand Junction. We will be staying at the Holiday Inn Express on Rae Lyn Street. The next morning, September 17, after a continental breakfast, we will tour Tammy Allen's Unique Auto Museum in Grand Junction. Then onto I-70 to the Grand Mesa for site-seeing and lunch and to Cedaredge and the Cedaredge Lodge for dinner, lodging and breakfast.
